Representative Gay Lynn Bennion proposes the following amendments:

- 1. Page 1, Lines 12 through 13:
  - requires municipalities and counties that allow short-term rentals <u>and have adopted an</u>
    ordinance or regulation requiring a permit for a short-term rental to adopt
  - ordinances or regulations to promote the health, safety, and welfare of short-term
- 2. Page 2, Lines 40 through 41:
  - 40 (2) A municipality that allows short-term rentals within the municipality and has adopted an ordinance or regulation requiring a permit for a short-term rental shall {adopt}
  - 41 <u>ordinances or regulations</u>} <u>include provisions in the ordinance or regulation</u> to promote the public health, public safety, and general welfare of the
- 3. Page 2, Lines 49 through 50:
  - 49 (2) A county that allows short-term rentals within an unincorporated area of the county and has adopted an ordinance or regulation requiring a permit for a short-term rental
  - 50 <u>shall</u> { <u>adopt ordinances or regulations</u>} <u>include provisions in the ordinance or regulation</u> <u>to promote the public health, public safety, and general</u>
- 4. Page 5, Lines 129 through 131:
  - (2) An owner shall ensure that a short-term rental has {, on each level where occupants
  - 130 are allowed, at least one functioning smoke detector, carbon monoxide detector, and fire
  - 131 <u>extinguisher.</u>} <u>:</u>
    - (a) interconnected functioning smoke alarms, with a smoke alarm in each sleeping area, a smoke alarm in each hallway leading to a sleeping area, and at least one smoke alarm on each level;
      - (b) a carbon monoxide alarm on each level; and
      - (c) a fire extinguisher on each level with a minimum classification of 2A10BC.
