Mr. Speaker,

The Political Subdivisions Committee reports a favorable recommendation on **1st Sub. S.B. 182**, HOMELESS SERVICES MODIFICATIONS, by Senator T. Weiler, with the following amendments, and, due to fiscal impact, recommends it be referred to the Rules Committee for prioritization.

- 1. Page Line 233 through 235:
 - 233 (5)"Code red event" means a weather event in which the National Weather Service predicts
 - 234 <u>a {HeatRisk of 2 Moderate or greater,}</u> <u>HeatRisk of 3 Major or greater,</u> including any other extreme weather conditions
 - 235 <u>established in rules made by the Department of Health and Human Services under</u>
- 2. Page Line 295 through 297:
 - 295 county for the duration of a code red alert:
 - 296 (a) except as provided in Subsection (2), a homeless shelter may expand the homeless shelter's capacity limit by up to 35% to
 - 297 provide temporary shelter to any number of individuals experiencing homelessness,
- 3. Page Line 315 through 317:
 - 315 (e)homeless shelters, state and local government entities, and other organizations that
 - provide services to individuals experiencing homelessness { shall } may coordinate street







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- outreach efforts to distribute to individuals experiencing homelessness any available
- 4. Page Line 326 through 328:
 - 326 (1)(a) through (f) to take effect, including local zoning ordinances.
 - 327 (2) A homeless shelter owned by a municipality may expand the homeless shelter's capacity limit to provide temporary shelter to any number of individuals experiencing homelessness, so long as the homeless shelter is in compliance with the applicable building code and fire code.
 - (3) A municipality or other local government entity { shall } may prioritize providing shelter for
 - individuals experiencing homelessness during a code red event at a facility described in
